Registration and Entry

Registration for entry to the School may be made on the enclosed form. Children may be registered to start at the School at the beginning of either the Autumn Term, Spring Term or Summer Term following their third birthday, but registration does not guarantee a place in the School.

SEN

It is our aim to include and make provision for children of different levels of ability, of different cultural and religious backgrounds and a wide variety of interests.

We include statemented children, on assessment of their needs and have two SENCOs who liaise with the relevant authorities with regard to all our SEN children. The school follows the SEN code of practice.

We welcome children who have English as an additional language (EAL). We give appropriate support when needed.
